What's been happening at Purley Nursery School?

World Book Day

On Friday 3rd March, Purley Nursery School celebrated World Book Day. The children were invited to dress up as one of their favourite book characters and bring in their own special books to share with adults and friends. It was lovely to see the children so confident in their outfits and designs and it was very impressive to see how intact they remained throughout the session too!



We also celebrated the day by inviting our Federation Partner Christ Church School over to share picture books with the children. We welcomed Mrs Imana and her Year 2 class to come and join us. The children loved exploring a range of books with their role model readers exploring their knowledge of letters and sounds with their peers.



Forest School

Forest School continues to be a great success and children are loving how this provision has evolved since it began in January. Children this half term have had the pleasure of experiencing a session with a real campfire! Claire and the Forest School Team welcomed Ella (EYFS practitioner and Forest School Teacher at Christ Church School) to come and light the fire pit and offer freshly cooked popcorn to the group. The children were excited to share their learning and memories with their friends at nursery and created their own campfire role



play and pretend popcorn during their nursery session. We would like to thank our dedicated parent volunteers Katie, Finn and Lindsey who enable us to carry out this fantastic initiative for children. We look forward to inviting our next group of children ready for Summer 1.

Visit from Purley Fire Station



The children were very excited to welcome real life 'Superheroes' to nursery this half term! Purley Fire Fighters joined us for an afternoon session and we were fortunate to have the chance to meet the team, watch them use the firefighters hose and climb into the Fire Engine! The children were so excited and keen to apply their learning to the classroom. We introduced a new 'Emergency Services Call Center' roleplay and added lots of props around the learning environment for children to apply their learning and creativity! It's been lots of fun and the children have developed lots of new skills in language, vocabulary and mark making! We hope to invite them again so that we can explore how their fire ladder works too!



We have been planting trees

The children have been exploring Spring life and have planted five new Dogwood shrubs in the outdoor classroom. Ali (Lead Teacher on Wednesdays) explored with the children the tree seedlings and they carefully dug holes and planted them into the ground. The children have been working hard to water and protect them from the elements as part of our nursery routines.



What is a Dogwood shrub?

Dogwood is a small broadleaf shrub, typically found growing along woodland edges and in hedgerows of southern England. Mature trees can grow to 10m. The bark is grey and smooth with shallow ridges which develop with age, and its twigs are smooth, straight and slim. Leaf buds are black and look like bristles, forming on short stalks.

Purley in Bloom

On Saturday 4th March, Purley in Bloom visited the nursery to create a small sensory area for the children in the outdoor classroom. Purley in Bloom volunteers kindly donated their time to weed and add new plants to a small area which will enable the children to explore a range of natural textures and shapes as they grow. We are fortunate to have organised for them to return and we would like to invite our whole school community to join us for our 'Outdoor Project Day' to undertake some new and exciting projects across the school environment.



Our '**Outdoor Project Day**' is scheduled for **Saturday 20th May from 10am - 2pm**. We will be offering free hot drinks, pastries and cakes as a thank you to all our hard working volunteers.

Purley Nursery School is very lucky to share such a large, rich environment for our children to support their learning and development. We love to involve the children as much as we can however some tasks require more time and adult strength and stamina. It's so wonderful when our school community can be a part of these developments. On the day, we hope to welcome our families and Purley in Bloom to help us activities such as:

- Weeding

- Planting hanging baskets
- Creating a new sensory welcome garden on the main entrance path
- Litter picking
- Planting seeds and bulbs

Welcome to new staff

This half term, we have had the pleasure of welcoming Mary to our School Staff Team. Attendance

Just a reminder that if your child is away from school for any reason please let Louise, Julie or Mary in the school office know. You can phone **(020 8660 5639)** or email **(office@purley.croydon.sch.uk)**.

As a Local Authority School, we are expected to monitor attendance and note on registers the reasons for absence. This attendance/absence data is requested by the Local Authority, the Department for Education and Ofsted. We have a duty to contact you if you have not informed us already that your child is absent - for any reason. Please, therefore, do contact us as indicated above as it is very time consuming to `phone families if you have not contacted us.

Drop off and collection times

Thank you to all families for being so prompt and supportive of our collection/ drop off times.

Nursery sessions times are as follows: **8.30-11.30am - 12.30-3.30pm**

All children are expected to attend their full nursery session and arrive on time. In recent weeks we have noticed that children are arriving considerably late and collected early from their nursery session. Please can parents be mindful that late arrival and collection may contribute to their child missing out on learning opportunities planned in the classroom/ carpet time. To support good routines and habits before transitioning to Primary School, we encourage parents and carers to make every effort to ensure their child access their full session.

Late collection of children may also result in late collection charge.

Travel management at drop off and collection times

Drop and collection is managed through our space indicators in the main entrance and through the support of our children and families. This is to ensure child safety and reduce the numbers of adults and children in the main entrance foyer at one time. During these chilly months, we appreciate that getting ready to leave nursery may take a little time, especially if children have hats and large coats etc. You can support your child and us to aid collection times by helping and encouraging your child to be independent with dressing and collecting these outdoor items at the end of session as swiftly as possible. In addition, if you wish to speak to a member of the nursery team, please request to move out of the collection queue to chat or use the messaging option on Seesaw. It is not possible for staff to speak to all parents at the end of the day however we do encourage parent partnerships as much as possible. If you are unsure or have any concerns about your child, please speak to Polly or Maria.



Purley Nursery School Breakfast Club

To support working families in the morning with drop off routines, Purley Nursery School can offer Breakfast Club care for children from 7.45am Monday to Friday. All children attending Breakfast Club are welcomed by Julie in The Nest and are offered a healthy breakfast and play to enable them to have a happy, calm start to their day.

Prices:

- **7.45am** - to the start of their nursery session - **£4.25 per day**
- **8.00am** - to the start of their nursery session **£3.00 per day**

We encourage all children to join our Home-School Library so if you haven't signed up please speak to Julie, Louise or Mary in the office so we can issue you with a plastic wallet (£1) or order you a Purley Nursery Book bag (£4.50).

Seesaw



Seesaw has been a great success this half term and it is great to see children engaging in home learning activities and sharing new experiences with nursery staff and their friends. If you have not downloaded Seesaw to access your child's journal and the activities set by Maria and the team please speak to a member of the nursery team or contact the school office.

Please note that Seesaw activities are non-compulsory and we encourage families to 'tap in' as and when they can to support their understanding of early learning and development.

Please check at home to see whether you might have any clothes belonging to the school. We'd be pleased if you could return them to us as soon as possible.

Snack and Cooking - VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTION

To enable the children to have a daily healthy fruit snack during the session and for the children to experience cooking activities each week, we are asking parents to make a voluntary contribution of £1 per week or £13 per term to help towards the cost. We rely on these donations to do this. If we do not receive enough contributions to do this we may need to reduce snack and cooking opportunities in the nursery. Useful Acronyms & Vocabulary about Safeguarding

- **DSL:** Designated Safeguarding Lead
 - **PREVENT:** Part of the PREVENT Governments Counter Terrorism Strategy to stop people being drawn into extremism
 - **SPOC:** Single Point of SPOC Contact (PREVENT) - responsible for preventing children being impacted by extremism
 - **LADO:** Local Authority LADO Designated Officer who deals with position of trust safeguarding issues
 - **DBS:** Disclosure & Barring DBS Service used to make safe recruitment decisions

What is the role of the DSL - Designated Safeguarding Lead

The Designated Safeguarding Lead has a crucial role in taking lead responsibility for child protection issues in school. At Purley Nursery School we have 3 DSL's: Polly, Maria and Kelly. A DSL is always available during school hours for staff to discuss any safeguarding concerns. As school policy there is always a DSL in school from 8.00am to 5.00pm and DSLs are always contactable by telephone outside these hours. DSL's are trained to take on this role and their training is updated every two years with additional training in between. The DSL has many responsibilities including working with staff and agencies involved in safeguarding children, working with parents and families, giving advice to staff, training staff, managing referrals from staff and investigating concerns passing them onto the correct body as necessary, managing the records of safeguarding and Child Protection concerns and keeping own knowledge up to date.

A message from Maria, Lead Teacher/Head of School



This academic year we have been fortunate to continue to make use of European funding which has enabled our staff to take part in a range of Professional Development Research trips.

So far:

- Rachael has visited Sweden to learn about Inclusion and Special Education.
- Maria has visited Sweden to learn about Wellbeing in Education.
- Julie and Rikta have visited Italy to learn about Creative approaches to Early Years teaching.

These wonderful opportunities allow us to reflect on what we do day to day at the Nursery, share good practice, learn from identified strengths in Education that are present in other countries across Europe and to engage in professional dialogue with other staff from our Federation partner, Christ Church School, as well as other local colleagues from Croydon, National and International Teachers and School Leaders.



On my recent trip I was able to learn about how Wellbeing is addressed culturally in Sweden for all employees, how Education and Childcare are seen as highly valued professions and important to society, how teachers are encouraged and trusted to manage their time effectively to achieve a good work life balance whilst still achieving some of the highest results for children and how this mindset is translated for the children as they are taught and encouraged to recognise these values and build life skills alongside their academic achievements.



Whilst we cannot replicate all the things we see and learn about, there are lots of ways in which key aspects can inform our practice and enhance the experience and achievement of children here at the Nursery.

KIDS EAT FREE EASTER 2023



MORRISONS

Kids eat for free in Morrisons Cafes every day from 3pm when you spend over £4.49 on a adult's meal.

YO! SUSHI

Kids under 10 get a free bento box deal when an adult spends at least £10. Offer runs 3 - 14 April 2023.

DOBBIES GARDEN CENTRE

From noon daily, kids can eat at Dobbies for free when an adult buys a main meal.

GORDON RAMSEY RESTAURANT

Kids under 8 can eat for free at Gordon Ramsey Restaurants when an adults eats from the à la carte menu.

BILL'S

Up to two kids eat for free at Bill's from 3-14 April (not weekends) when an adult orders a main dish.

PAUSA CAFÉ at DUNELM

Spend £4 and get one free choice from the Kids Menu in Pausa Cafés on Monday to Friday after 3pm.

PREZZO

Kids aged under 10 get a 3 course meal free at Prezzo. No adult spend, but you must have o2 Priority app.

BEEFEATER

Get two free kids' breakfasts for under 16s at Beefeater when you buy an unlimited adult breakfast.

BREWERS FAYRE

Get two free kids' breakfasts for under 16s at Brewers Fayre when you buy an unlimited adult breakfast.

THE REAL GREEK

Children under 12 years get a free meal on Sundays when an adult spends over £10.
